



Simon Beckett Student Paper Prize Application Guidelines

Eligibility Requirements:

- An undergraduate or graduate student in good academic standing with the Department of Anthropology at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville.
- Presenting at the upcoming the American Academy of Forensic Sciences annual meeting.
- The student(s) must be the only author(s) or must be the first and presenting author if co-authored with a professor. In the latter case, the professor must submit a letter explaining the relative contribution of the professor and the student(s).

Instructions:

- Please submit a cover letter that includes the session title, presentation title, date, and time of the presentation being given at the American Academy of Forensic Sciences Meeting.
- Please submit the accepted AAFS abstract.
- Please submit the completed presentation, either a pdf of a poster or the PowerPoint and/or manuscript for a podium presentation.
- The prize(s) will be awarded after the AAFS meetings. The initial prize, awarded for the presentation of the paper, is \$600. The recipient(s) will receive another \$600 if the manuscript is submitted and accepted into a peer reviewed journal within one year of the award date. If there are multiple student authors they will share the \$600 prize.

Deadline:

• All materials must be submitted directly to Dr. Steadman by the deadline specified on the website and participate in the practice session in order to be eligible for the award. Please see the website or contact Dr. Steadman for exact deadlines each year.
